Established in 2009, <u>Workforce Matters</u> is a national network of grantmakers that draws on expert and practitioner knowledge and works together to strengthen workforce development philanthropy such that it empowers workers, learners, and job seekers to realize their full potential; dismantle inequities based on race, gender, ability, and other individual characteristics; and advances equitable education and employment outcomes for youth and adults.

Grantmaking Organizations

Individual Grantmakers

We have approximately 440 grantmaking organizations on our listserv, comprising over 1300 individuals. Thirty-one of these organizations, representing about 170 grantmakers, contribute financially to support our work.

Workforce Matters offers virtual and in-person programming that promotes learning, networking, and collaboration among workforce development grantmakers, including informational webinars, funder-to-funder discussions, communities of practice, learning tours, convenings, and networking events. We also share content about best practices, innovative program models, and research through our newsletter, blog, video archive, and original publications. In 2022, we announced the launch of our first pooled fund, The Fund for Workforce Equity, which provided flexible resources to 15 workforce organizations seeking to launch, expand, or deepen their learning about strategies to center workers and learners of color. In 2023, we launched the Workforce Grantmaking in Native Nations and Communities initiative and in 2024 we awarded grant funding to eight Native and Tribal led organizations. In the Fall of 2024, we launched Round two of the Fund for Workforce Equity and we anticipate awarding funding to seven organizations in February 2025.
